

KIDS' ZONE Preschool



This is a great way to prepare little ones for Easter.




Elementary

Middle School/High School ("YA" or Young Adult Books)




Revelation of Divine Love by Julian of Norwich

Ted Dekker crafts a good story that keeps my interest all the way through. In the books I've read so far, I've been fascinated by his use of imagery. I also recommend The Martyr's Song, also by Dekker (part of a four-book series which includes *The Martyr's Song*, Heaven's Wager, When Heaven Weeps, and Thunder of Heaven). In The Martyr's Song, two women are taken back to Bosnia in the WWII era, in which a small group of women and children must answer the question "What would you die for?" 


